The theme suggested by a network member will be to explore the experience from coordinator-, state- and community-level of multinational files. We will hear short presentations on the Nordic clinker-boat file sent to UNESCO in March 2020 and Baltic song and dance celebrations file inscribed in 2008.

What input can the multinational files have on safeguarding intangible cultural heritage (ICH) on a national and local level? Do multinational files manage to take care of the community involvement, or does the process move focus on the interstate level? How can we use the experiences gained from the international files to strengthen the cooperation of different ICH stakeholders in the Nordic and Baltic regions?

In the webinar, we will also discuss in smaller groups, which will be summed up in plenum and give feedback on future seminar themes and evaluate whether the online seminar-form is useful for regular online network seminars until/in addition to an annual physical seminar. In addition, it will be given information from the committee and the safeguarding practices web page.
